# The Playoffs Are Here!

We have finally arrived at what we have been playing for all year—the 2020 Tony Albrecht Cup Playoffs. Three flights will compete over four weeks for \$1000 in prize money in each flight. Here's how it works:

- All year long you have been accumulating qualifying points in three ways—your position in an event, the number of events you played and the number of flight wins you accumulated. Those totals have produced a ranking (see below) for the beginning of the playoffs.
- The three flights are created by ranking all eligible players, i.e., those having played at least 8 events, based on handicap. Fifty-nine players are eligible, giving us flights consisting of 20, 20 and 19 competitors.
- For each of the first three rounds, you can add to your accumulated points. Finishing first in your playoff flight (note this is different from your individual event flight) earns 20 points. Second is worth 12; third, 8; fourth, 6; fifth, 4; and all others who play, 2.
- At the end of the third round at Longbow, the points are reset, with the leader at 100, then each succeeding place 10 points lower (90, 80, 70, etc.). From 10<sup>th</sup> place on, all players will have 10 points.
- · In the final round, points then distribute as follows:

## Tournament Review—More Ringers at Longbow

Forty-nine players completed at Longbow on Saturday, 39 of whom were looking to improve their Ringers score in Round 4. Dan Shumaker and John Wilhelm were medalists for the day at 73, while Kevin Hudspeth grabbed the low net with 62.

The field averages were slight better than last week at 90.0 gross and 76.0 net. The hardest hole this time was the long par-4 9<sup>th</sup>, playing to an average of 1.55 strokes over par. The easiest was again the par-3 3<sup>rd</sup> at +0.49.

There were 34 birdies by 22 different players on 14 holes. Dan and Ron Sweat each had four of them.

It was déjà vu all over again for Elmer Schmidt, who won Flight 1 for the second week in a row with an identical 77/69 to win Flight 1. John lit up Flight 2 at 73/64. Ron cruised in Flight 3 at 78/64, as did Kevin in Flight 4 at 92/62.

Skins were rarer and therefore more valuable this week. Kevin was the only player with multiples in one game, earning two on the Net side.
