

Tournament Recap-Lookout Mountain

Forty-one SGL golfers closed out the Fall portion of the schedule at Lookout Mountain. The course provided it usual challenge, playing to an average gross of 92.4 and average net of 81.2. Yet another under-par round claimed medalist honors, as Jordan Murray posted a blistering 2-under 70. Low net went to Shaun Wilson at 68.

It was a good day for birdies. There were 34 in total, coming from 19 players on 16 holes. Only the 3rd and 17th failed to yield one. Jordan had five. In addition, Kyle Rector scored an eagle on the par-5 15th.

The hardest hole was the small target, downhill par-3 11th, playing to an average of +1.63 strokes over-par, while the easiest was #1, the par-4 playing at +0.61.

Jeff Thursam was the Flight 1 winner, with a gross of 74 and net 75. Shaun picked up Flight 2 with 75/68. George Banach led Flight 3 at 88/76. Adam Dizes took Flight 4, shooting 95/71. Jordan won the Callaway Flight, as his 70 also netted to 70.

Jeff's winning effort was helped along by two CTPs, on the 9th and 11th holes. The others went to Amy Arnold on the 6th and Shaun on #16.

Eleven different players drew from the Deuce pot.

Low Putts saw a four-way tie between Jordan, Bill McKiegan, Elmer Schmidt and John Garner. Each had 30.

SGL's 2021 Individual Match Play Tournament is coming up quickly, with an intended start date of January 16 at Ocotillo. If you have not tried this before, match play is a really fun way to compete. Each hole becomes its own contest, so you can quickly refocus on the task at hand rather than stew over the snowman you just posted on the last hole.

Our format this year will be the same as last. We will have a round-robin with groups four players in either four brackets (three matches) or six brackets (five matches). At the end of that, the winner in each group will move on to the single elimination finals. Below is how it looked after the round-robin portion last year. Jeff, Dave, Steve and Dan then went on the "Final Four".
