Tournament Review—We-Ko-Pa (Saguaro)

Our return engagement at We-Ko-Pa went about as expected, with the Saguaro course turning out to be about two strokes easier than was Cholla. Average gross for the field came in at 92.4 and average net at 78.7. Jeff Thursam was our medalist with 75, while Bryan Nelson claimed the low net with 66.

Thirty birdies were posted by nineteen different players on thirteen holes. Ty Thursam led the way with four. The easiest hole, yielding seven of the birdies was the short par-4 10th, playing to an average of 0.68 strokes over par. The hardest was the long par-4 12th, at +1.83.

Gerry Owsianny won Flight 1, shooting 78/net 72. Dan Gallegos won Flight 2 for the second straight week, with the same 79/70 combination he posted on Cholla. Bryan topped Flight 3, as his net 66 was off a gross of 81. Richard Powers took Flight 4 with 89/70 and Greg Hileman won the Callaway Flight at 75/70.

Shaun Wilson earned the CTP on the 5th hole, while the others went to Dan on the 9th, Greg on the 11th and Gerry on the 15th. Of those, only Dan's was converted to a Deuce, but other Deuces were made by John Steinke on the 9th, Jeff Thursam and Steve Park on the 11th and Taylor Elrod on the 15th.

No doubt a major contributor to Jeff's 75 was his winning the Low Putts crown with just 26—four fewer than anyone else.

Dan led the list of 27 money winners with \$99.

Should your team make it through a qualifier, the Championship final is on Monday, December 6 at Seville Golf and Country Club.
