Tournament Recaps—Dove Mountain (Wild Burro/Tortolita) and Quarry Pines

Distance and heat seem to have conspired to produce a couple of low turnouts last weekend at Dove Mountain and Quarry Pines in Marana. There were 18 players on Saturday and just 9 on Sunday, resulting in the rare two-flight tournament.

The statistical summary is below. The low participation numbers yielded some interesting results. Highlights and lowlights include:

- The highest average gross and net scores in two plus years of tracking with 99.4 and 86.5 at Dove Mountain.
- The lowest birdie rate over the same period (1.2%), which happened at both courses. There were just 4 birdies at Dove Mountain and 3 were on one hole (Tortolita #6, par-4). There were just 2 at Quarry Pines.
- That said, we did see the season's first eagle, as Prag Shah accomplished that on the very first hole at Quarry Pines. Nice way to start the day.
- There were no Deuces either day, although Prag's eagle draws from that pot.
- The hardest hole Sunday was the par-3 11th at Quarry Pines. At an average of +2.78 over-par, it was the most difficult since we began tracking and a full stroke harder than any other hole on the course. While there were again just 9 players, none even made par on it.
- Elmer Schmidt's net 67 on Sunday was seven strokes better than anyone else.
- Kyle Mast figured something out on the greens at Dove Mountain that no one else could, as his 28 putts were four fewer than his closest pursuer. Same for Elmer at Quarry Pines, as his 29 were three better than all others.
- Each day had only one Gross Skin awarded—Amy Arnold on Saturday and Bo Montgomery on Sunday.
- All nine players won some money on Sunday, ranging from \$39 for Elmer to \$3 for Nandita Shah.
