There are few clubs in our bag that are more important than our putter. Before the Pings and Scotty's, the putter had an interesting beginning. The head was usually made of a hard wood, Beech, and was attached to a shaft of Ash wood - these were known as "cleeks". In the 19th century, a Scottish divinity student named Robert Adam Paterson welded some shavings from an Indian tree together to form the "gutta percha", which was the first metal putter head. Putters have been very famous, for example, Bobby Jones had a flat stick putter made of hickory with a metal head and called it "Calamity Jane". No one can forget the iconic scene in Caddyshack when Judge Smails called for the "old Billy Baroo". And, of course, we're all familiar with the worn spot on Tiger's Scotty Cameron putter.
