DID YOU KNOW?

Long before the multi-pocket, insulated, colorful golf bags we know and use today, players simply carried their clubs bound with a soft twine. In the late 1880s, the invention of the golf bag became popular. The first bags had a small opening - usually just four inches in diameter, about the size of a golf hole and was stitched together with a canvas material. Due to their cylindrical appearance, the early bags were commonly referred to as "pencil bags", which is a far cry from Rodney Dangerfield's bag in Caddyshack.

HOLE IN ONE ALERT!

Jared Nielsen drained his tee shot (along with the hole in one pool) when he ACED the Par 3 16th hole. Here's the story in his own words:

"On hole 16, I had the distance at 143 yards with a front pin location. I carry the 9-iron about 140 yards and thought, if anything, I'll hit with a full swing and the ball will be a little long but safe in the middle of the green. As we approached the green I couldn't see a ball and I knew it wasn't long. Sure enough, it was in the cup! Elmer Schmidt, David Fang, and Mitchell Bacon were awesome yelling with high five's! I have never had a hole in one before... that was my first. I could get used to that!"

A HUGE congratulations to Jared... his ACE earned him \$435. Time to fill the hole in one pot!
