

DID YOU KNOW?

The golf tee has a history! In the early days of golf, golfers were allowed to tee up their ball by placing their ball within a club length of the original lie to tee it up on a higher piece of ground or grass. A golfer was also expected to wet the sand or dirt with a wet towel and create a mound which led to dirty hands and kind of a mess. The first tees were made a paper, and then cork and rubber. There were several versions in the early days but Dr. George Grant, one of the first black graduates from Harvard Dental School, invented the first wooden tee which consisted of a wooden peg attached to a rubber tube with a small cup on the top.
