SGL TIP OF THE WEEK

Is it legal or illegal to stand behind a player who is putting to gauge the line and/or break?

Though it might feel wrong, there is nothing in the USGA Rules to stop a fellow competitor, or opponent, standing wherever they like – even if that means they're behind you tracking the exact line of your putt.

Rule 10.2b (4), which covers the restrictions on a caddie standing behind a player, only extends to partners, team players and their bag carriers under Rules 22, 23 and 24.

Rule 1.2a, which looks at standards of player conduct, expects all players to "play in the spirit of the game" and one of the examples given is not distracting the play of another player.

So yes, you can ask a player to move out of your sight line!
