Big Swings in Summer Series Finals

With its shorter lead-in compared to the Tony Albrecht Cup, the Summer Series is prone to two-week hot streaks and lots of movement in the standings. That was quite evident in two of the three flights in the finals at Eagle Mountain on August 28.

In Flight 1, Bo Montgomery started the day in fifth place, 28 points behind leader Amy Arnold and 20 behind second-place Steve Park. Then Bo went out and shot a blistering 1-under 70 with three birdies and just two bogeys. Steve's 3rd-place finish on the day put him in a tie with Bo at 185 total points, but Bo won by virtue of the better finish in the round. Overshadowed by Bo's performance was a five-birdie front nine from Elmer Schmidt, which had him sitting at 2-under 33 heading to the back.

In Flight 2, Bryan Nelson teed off in 4th place, 43 points behind the lead. He then posted an 81/net 69 to leapfrog into first place over Jeff Coughran.

Flight 3 finished the way it started, with Martin Henner on top. He started the round with a 9-point lead and extended it even further by winning the day with a 90/69. He also won the previous week at Grayhawk. Winning both events is a solid strategy for earning the playoff title.

Tucson Trio

A small group of SGL golfers spent their Labor Day weekend in the Tucson area, as the league opened its 2021-22 season with a three-day, three-venue trip. We played Tubac (home of Tin Cup), a challenging Arizona National, and Sewailo (home to the U of A golf teams).

The full stats summary is below. Here are some notable highlights:

- Steve Hulka picked up flight wins and medalist honors at both Tubac and Arizona National.
- · Birdies were extremely difficult to come by at Arizona National, as there were only seven total and only five players made any.
- On the other hand, there were seven birdies from just sixteen total players on the par-5 6th at Sewailo. The double-dogleg hole shows 468 yards from the Jade tees but is only 410 as the crow flies and only requires about 210 yards off the tee to cut off the first leg. Despite a green almost completely surrounded by bunkers, many players were on in two. Our field collectively played the hole at 0.25 strokes <u>under par</u>—something we may never see again.
- Dan Gallegos and Mitchell Bacon both earned three CTPs on the trip, with Dan's coming one each day.
- Dan's brothers, Mark and Stephen, flew in from New Mexico for the weekend and comprised the Callaway Flight all three days. Mark went 3-0 in the sibling rivalry.

Partners must be from the same club and there is no limit to the number of teams a club can send to one of the qualifying tournaments in November. Saturday Golf League has entered as many as eight teams to this event in past years, with a few moving past the qualifiers and into the championship final. So far, we have at least five for this year.

This year, the qualifying event schedule is:

- Wednesday, November 3—The Golf Club at Dove Mountain (Gross/Net and Super Seniors)
- Wednesday, November 10—Lone Tree Golf Club (Championship Flight only)
- Tuesday, November 16—Wigwam Red Course (Gross/Net Flights only)
- Wednesday, November 17—Aguila Golf Club (Gross/Net and Super Seniors)
- Tuesday, November 30—Longbow Golf Club (Gross/Net Flights only)

Should your team make it through a qualifier, the Championship final is on Monday, December 6 at Seville Golf and Country Club and the league will pay your entry fee for that event.

The team entry fee for a qualifier is \$140 and the deadline for signing up is Friday, September 24. For more information on how it all works and where to find an entry form, visit the <u>Club Team Championship portal</u>.
